

Starting Your Search at the Library Website

Starting from the U of T Libraries website, you have a few options for where to start your search. If you're interested in looking for books, e-books, journals, or DVDs, then LibrarySearch would be the best place to start. LibrarySearch will search for all of those items and more available through the library all at once.

An article search here will search across databases in all disciplines, so it may give you results in areas of study you're not interested in, depending on the keyword you use. For example, a general article search for antiracism AND education will find articles from education, as well as those in the area of politics, which may not be of interest to you. It is good research practice to know and use subject specific databases related to your field of study, as they can provide a more comprehensive and in-depth search on your specific topic.

To locate subject specific databases, select databases under the search box, then select by article databases by subject A-Z. When you click on a specific subject or use a drop down menu to select the subject area, you will see a list of article databases in that subject where you can begin searching for journal articles.

We recommend signing in with your UTORid and password if you wish to save your items or searches for later.
